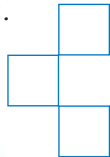




## RSNA'S COMMITTEE ON INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS AND EDUCATION (CIRE)

## INTRODUCTION TO RESEARCH FOR INTERNATIONAL YOUNG ACADEMICS

Held during the RSNA Scientific Assembly and Annual Meeting, this program encourages radiologists in the early stages of their research career—residents, fellows, and radiologists up to 2 years beyond training—from countries outside the United States and Canada to pursue careers in academic radiology.

*Application Deadline: April 15*

## INTERNATIONAL VISITING PROFESSOR PROGRAM

Up to four teams of two or three visiting professors are sent to lecture at national radiology society meetings and satellite institutions with radiology residency training programs in developing or newly developed nations.

**VISITING PROFESSOR** Candidates should be dynamic, experienced radiology teachers and currently hold an academic appointment in North America or other developed country.

## NATIONAL RADIOLOGY SOCIETIES

serving developing nations are invited to apply to host a team of visiting professors to lecture at their society meeting. Selected societies will organize visits to educational institutions with active radiology training programs that can benefit from a visiting professor team.

*December 31, 2011 for 2013 visits*  
*December 31, 2012 for 2014 visits, etc.*

## DEREK HARWOOD-NASH INTERNATIONAL FELLOWSHIP

This fellowship allows an international institution to benefit by sending a faculty member to study for a 6- to 12-week period in North America. Interested candidates must be promising radiology scholars who are 3 to 10 years out of training, and who demonstrate that their educational goals can be met most appropriately by study in a North American institution. RSNA covers travel expenses and modest living expenses for a 6- to 12-week period.

*Application Deadline: July 1*

## EDUCATION MATERIALS AND JOURNAL AWARD PROGRAM

Radiology teaching institutions and medical libraries in developing nations may apply to receive gratis subscriptions to the RSNA journals *Radiology* and/or *RadioGraphics* and/or available RSNA education materials.

*Application Deadline: Ongoing (annual)*

## E-MENTORING

A program to provide radiology residency programs in developing and newly developed countries with real-time, interactive, distance-learning opportunities in evidence-based radiology. This is supported by the development of communities of learners and other tools, and encourages the development of lifelong learning skills.

## OTHER PROGRAMS

**EDUCATION SCHOLAR GRANT:** A 2-year grant for teachers and leaders in radiology education, providing critically needed educational tools that will enable them to share their expertise with the radiology community.

**RESEARCH SEED GRANT:** A 1-year grant providing investigators the means to gain experience in defining objectives and testing hypotheses, preparing them for major grant submissions to corporations, foundations, and governmental agencies.
