MEETING FACTS

(as of 11/8/05)

The Scientific Assembly and Annual Meeting of the Radiological Society of North America (RSNA) is the world's largest international medical meeting. The meeting is a premier event for physicians sharing medical knowledge with one another.

Facts about the meeting include:

- Six days of educational programs for radiologists, radiation oncologists, physicists in medicine and allied health care professionals;
- Professional registration is up 2% compared with 2004; total number of attendees pre-registered for RSNA 2005 is up 3% compared with 2004;
- Attendees will occupy nearly 22,324 hotel rooms on peak night, spread over 67 Chicago hotels;
- Spouse/guest pre-registration is up 5% compared with last year's level;
- Total square footage of exhibit space is 8% above last year's totals;
- 720 technical exhibits occupying 488,852 square feet;
- 131 (18%) of the exhibitors are first-time exhibitors at RSNA;
- Attendees will contribute nearly \$112 million to Chicago's economy;
- More than 2,072 research presentations and posters covering 16 subspecialties: breast; cardiac; chest; emergency; gastrointestinal; genitourinary; health services, policy and research; musculoskeletal; neuroradiology/head and neck; nuclear medicine; pediatric; physics; radiation oncology and radiobiology; radiology and informatics; ultrasound; and vascular and interventional
- 299 refresher courses;
- 1,219 education exhibits covering 16 subspecialties;
- An *infoRAD* exhibit area with over 150 *infoRAD* exhibits and more than 50 tutorial classes, including hands-on computer self-instruction and interactive video demonstration stations.
