The **Radiological Society of North America (RSNA)**, the **Association of University Radiologists (AUR)** and the **American Roentgen Ray Society (ARRS)** offer an **Introduction to Academic Radiology** program for second-year residents.

The focus of this program is to encourage young radiologists to pursue careers in academic radiology. The program consists of special seminars held during the RSNA and ARRS Annual Meetings.

Nominations must be made by the candidate's department chairperson or training director and are limited to one nomination per department. Eighty residents will be selected to attend the annual meeting of either the RSNA or ARRS.

The purpose of this program is to:

- Introduce residents to research and other academic opportunities early in their training;
- Demonstrate the importance of research to the practice and future of radiology;
- Share the excitement and satisfactions of research careers in radiology, and
- Introduce residents to successful clinical radiology researchers, future colleagues and potential mentors

- Designing a Research Question
- Finding a Mentor
- Critical Review of Scientific Literature
- Publishing Your Manuscript in *Radiology*
