 In spite of the progressive feminization of all physician workforce, women continue to be underrepresented in leadership positions, a phenomenon known as the "leaky pipeline"


 While this situation is well documented in the United States, literature and data from Spain and Europe is scarce and, as for Europe, hard to obtain due to the inherent heterogeneity between countries


Purpose


To carry out an analysis of the situation of women radiologists in Spain and comparing it to that of Europe and the United States of America


Methods

- 4) National survey including public health care system hospitals with >300 beds in Spain Response rate: 60% (70 out of 118 hospitals)







Conclusion

- Although gender disparities are increasingly less patent, still entail an important issue that must be addressed to create a diverse and inclusive workplace
