From the beginning, the Foundation has remained dedicated to the future of radiology by developing investigators and supporting lifelong research. Over the past 40 years, the Foundation has awarded more than 1,900 grants. For every dollar awarded by the RSNA R&E Foundation, recipients have received approximately \$60 additional dollars in subsequent funding from other sources.
